THE SHENANDOAH VALLEY CHORAL SOCIETY has brought exciting concerts of fine choral music to Shenandoah audiences since 1970. Formed to sing the Beethoven Ninth Symphony with the Shenandoah Valley Music Festival Orchestra in a concert honoring the 200th anniversary of the composer's birth, the Choral Society soon became a permanently organized chorus, presenting its own concerts, many with instrumentalists from the Shenandoah Valley area as well as with the Richmond Symphony and the Fairfax Symphony. The Choral Society usually offers concerts each year during the Christmas season, in the spring, and during the summer. Its repertoire ranges from large classical works to the music of Broadway.

Some singers are professionally trained and music is their vocation, but most are amateurs whose various occupations reflect the community at large. All sing for the joy of it.
